Managing Seed


- Weed seed, dirt, extra chaff that can be avoided by smart harvesting and threshing
- Volume reduction: don't move material that you don't need to move
- Separate and label lots avoid contamination
- Use tools that are appropriate for your scale
- Record keeping: don't need to reinvent the wheel every year


















































































Seed Storage

- Seeu Storage
 Cool, dry, and dark.
 Minimum fluctuation of storage conditions.
 Heat and humidity together should stay under 100.
 Airtight containers with dessicant, or breathable cotton muslin bags.
 Protection from pests.
